## Module C Review Exercise, 11/16/04

Respond to the following two questions concisely (try to fit *within the provided space*). As before, these are an open-ended and extremely challenging problems; nobody knows a good solution. Thus, you are not expected to find a real solution; you are actually *not* expected to know much about the topics. What you still should be able to do is use the skills practiced during Module C and the information available in the video to logically present your own idea about complex problems like these.

1. While a lot of food is wasted (especially) in this country, there are a huge number of people around the world who are dying of hunger (“world hunger”). **Propose** a way to solve this problem (i.e., world hunger) by *referring to both (a) your understanding of society as discussed in Module C, and (b) one or more examples in the video.*

2. Many scientists warn that our planet is gradually (but not consistently) warming (“global warming”). If this is in fact the case, there could be catastrophic effects on our future existence, e.g., rising sea level, extreme weathers. One of the main causes of the problem is industrial pollution in various forms, e.g., automobile exhaust. **Propose** a way to solve this problem (i.e., global warming) by *referring to both (a) your understanding of society as discussed in Module C, and (b) one or more examples in the video.*
